

## **Holy Trinity C of E Primary School Pupil Premium Report 2019-20**



The Pupil Premium Funding was introduced by the Government in April 2011.

In the financial year 2019/2020, individual schools were allocated funding for children from low-income families who were eligible for Free School Meals, those who had been entitled to free school meals in the last six years (EV6), Looked After Children and those from families with parents in the Armed Forces and pupils who have been subject to a Residency Order, Special Guardianship Order or been adopted after being in care.

In line with our Pupil Premium Policy, funds were allocated to facilitate access to education and the curriculum, provide additional teaching and learning opportunities and additional support and intervention. Our aim is to narrow the gap between Pupil Premium pupils and their peers.

We were allocated the following funding based upon the January census 2018:

The school has received in financial year 19/20 £1007 Early Years Pupil Premium for summer term and £805.60 for autumn term.

Allocation of Funding	
Staff focussed intervention for both academic and SEMH support for pupils 1.5 x HLTA. Offer basic skills on 1 to 1 / small group or support within the class using interventions such as Lexia, Symphony Maths, Dynamo Maths, Talk Boost, Reading Plus Code X. Also supporting with homework, daily reading, spellings and timetables, dough disco. SEMH includes mentoring, Thrive, nurture groups, social groups, drawing and talking therapy, sand play therapy, bereavement therapy, learning skills.	£26,000
