

Curriculm Coverage for Year 4 Summer Term



Curriculum Area	Coverage
English	This term we will be reading the novel 'Billionaire Boy' by David Walliams to develop our writing. This is a very exciting book that will support children in writing recounts and producing descriptive writing. We will also have a key focus on reading this term whereby children will look at developing their comprehension and reading skills.
Mathematics	This term the children will be concentrating on their knowledge of measure, geometry and statistics. This will include applying measure knowledge to perimeter and area and geometry knowledge to shape, symmetry, position and direction. The children will also learn about angles and will apply their understanding to compare and measure a range of angles.
Science	During the first half term we will be learning about we will investigate the link between vibrations and sound. We will also learn about pitch and volume. Next, living things and their environments. Children will explore using classification keys in the local environment. Children will also develop an understanding of environmental changes that pose a danger to living things.
Religious Education	During this term your child will be learning about the 'Kingdom of God'. We will develop understanding surrounding the question 'When Jesus left, what was the impact of Pentecost?' by making clear links between the Day of Pentecost and Christian belief about the Kingdom of God and Earth.
Computing	During this half term we will focus on the topic 'Digital Literacy'. Children will develop their skills when working on publishing softwares in order to collect information using refined searches and create presentations and posters.
History	Our topic for this term is Ancient Greece. Your child will learn to use words and phrases to
Geography Art and Design	describe the passing of time and to make connections and comparisons between life then and now.
Music	Your child will receive weekly music lessons from Apollo Arts which will entail 'A glimpse into the magical (and musical!) world of Harry Potter. We'll study how the music helps us to believe that broomsticks can fly and that good can conquer evil. The focus will be on exploring, understanding and then utilising composition techniques such as leitmotif, timbre, instrumentation, and tonality.'
P.E	The first half term, your child will have a weekly football lesson on a Monday which will continue to develop their skills. Your child will continue to take part in a weekly swimming session developing their confidence in water and water safety. In the second half of the term, your child will receive cricket lessons from Mr Richardson and continue to swim on a Friday.
French	Your child will receive weekly French lessons from Mr Tinjod. In these lessons the children will be working on the time. They will learn how to say o'clock, quarter past, half past and quarter to.
Homework	Every Tuesday your child will be bringing home a set of spellings to learn, they will be tested every Monday. It is their responsibility to practice their key words at home. Your child is aware of their own personal targets for their daily times table challenge. Your child will also be given homework every Thursday, which is expected to be completed by the following Tuesday. On occasions, your child will be asked to complete 'talk homework' where they should research information at home about a particular subject and this will be used within lessons.

Within all curriculum areas we ensure that all children are able to access the curriculum including those with SEN and be appropriately challenged.
