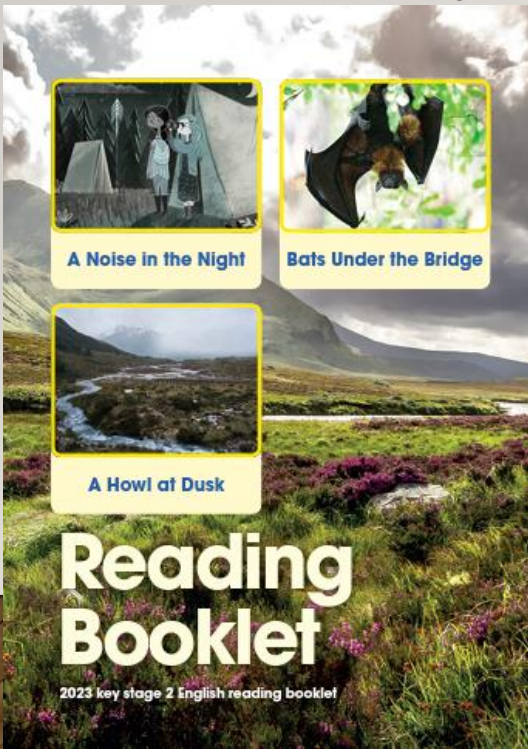

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# MATHS REASONING PAPER 3

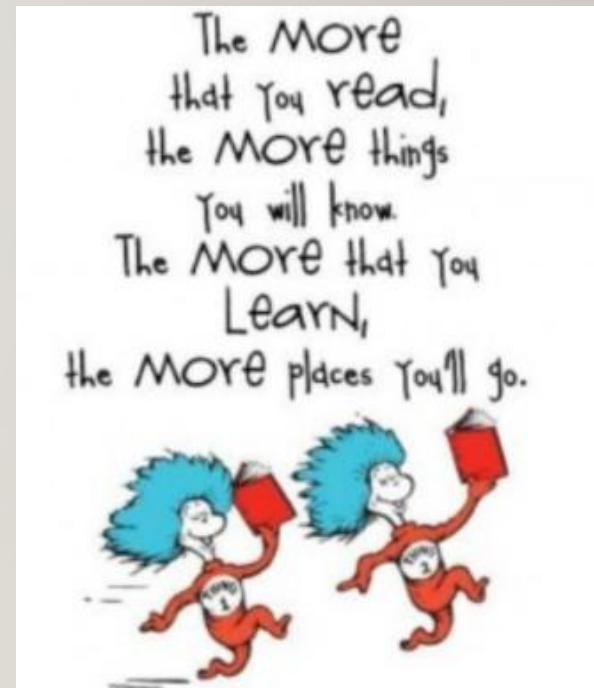
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- The children have 40 minutes to answer 26 questions.

# HOW TO SUPPORT AT HOME

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- *Reading often* is key, to improving the children's speed and comprehension.
- We like to encourage 'reading for pleasure.'
- That way the children will see reading as something they enjoy, rather than something they have to do for homework.





# HOW TO SUPPORT AT HOME

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- *Maths fluency* is key. The quicker the children are at their times tables the easier every topic will be.
- We practice in class as much as we can and the children know which times tables they should be practicing.
- If the children could practice at home regularly this would benefit them enormously.

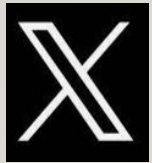
