

### READING



- We will be using Accelerated Reader this year.
- Accelerated Reader is an exciting reading system for children in Year 6.
- Effective system for motivating children to read and supporting good reading progress.
- At the beginning of the academic year, your child will take a STAR Reading test.
- Children answer questions with multiple choice answers about a short text read on a computer.
- Your child will be given a book level range with texts which will challenge and motivate their reading.

## ACCELERATED READER - STAR READER TEST



- Your child will answer 30 multiple choice questions based on very short pieces of text.
- This will give tem a ZPD range e.g 4,2 5.7. They can then choose any book within that range.
- After they finish the book they log on and complete a quiz. They are then awarded points which are recorded on 'Our Reading Road.'

# YOUR CHILD CAN READ ANY BOOK WITHIN THEIR RANGE

### How will I know if a book has an AR quiz?

- There are several ways of achieving this. Your child can bring a book into school, log in to the system and search for the quiz.
- Alternatively, the AR Book Finder service available at <u>www.arbookfind.co.uk</u> allows you to search all available books with AR quizzes.

### READING IN CLASS

- We will be completing 30 minutes of independent reading daily in class. After 25 minutes the children will be prompted to complete an entry in their reading diary.
- If your child chooses to read at home in their own time,
   House Points will be awarded for every extra reading comment.





### HOW TO SUPPORT AT HOME

- Reading often is key, to improving the children's speed and comprehension.
- · We like to encourage 'reading for pleasure.'
- That way the children will see reading as something they enjoy, rather than something they have to do at school.



### HOW TO SUPPORT AT HOME

- Maths fluency is key. The quicker the children are at their times tables the easier every topic will be.
- We practice in class as much as we can and they children know which times tables they should be practicing.
- If the children could practice at home regularly this would benefit them enormously.

- All letters should now be joined and should sit on the lines.
